# "Youth at the Top 2016": a beautiful experience and some unforgettable memories!

# On 12th and 13th July, throughout the Alps and the Carpathians,

## more than 500 young people reached the summit

#### A reminder- What is "Youth at the Top"?

It's a project which every year mobilises groups of young people from different countries in the Alps and the Carpathians on a common date, in an active, civic process, with an imaginative approach. The operation proposes a collective framework, while leaving plenty of room for local initiatives.



### "Youth at the Top" : what an adventure!

On 12th and 13th July, for the second edition of the operation, almost 700 participants (more than 500 young people and about 150 adults) from 8 countries of the Alps and the Carpathians together saw what it was like to live as a group and share exciting moments in the mountains: an event that will long remain in their memories.

In all, 37 events took place in the Alpine Arc and 4 in the Carpathians. Initially more than 50 events were planned, but some organisers were forced to cancel or postpone their project because of thunderstorms. Despite this constraint, most events were held at the date scheduled. In very cool temperatures, walking in the rain and at times even facing snow, the youngsters reached their summit and spent the night there. In refuges, bivouacking or in tents.

#### Young people: we like to be at the Top!

During the event young people took part in an artistic activity which took on different and varied forms. Some groups watched the stars, others did light painting; some painted rocks and even cows, or explored Alpine fauna and flora in an innovative way.

This year, for the first time, they all wrote a postcard addressed symbolically to the other participants, where they expressed themselves freely by drawings or texts. Several of them highlighted their new-found or re-discovered love of the mountains: (see the testimonials below).

The local organisers spontaneously said how much they had enjoyed leading this project and how happy they felt to see young people blossoming during their stay in the mountains!

# A collective operation to get young people (back) into contact with nature

"Youth at the Top" has a growing number of partners and young participants, the latter having almost doubled since the first test-edition in 2015.

This initiative aims to heighten young people's awareness of mountains and their natural and cultural environment; to help them to feel connected to mountains through feeling, observing, playing, encountering, imagining, dreaming or self-expression. The project has great symbolic value as it runs simultaneously throughout the Alps and the Carpathians. It enables youngsters to get to know their mountain heritage better and strengthen their feeling of belonging to the Alps or to the Carpathians, as well as to Europe itself, for it brings together young people from France, Italy, Austria, Germany, Switzerland, Slovenia, and as far as Slovakia and Romania!
